### SECTION ONE - Overcoming the Obstacles

#### FINDING HIS PROMISE

- "Come to Me, and I will give you rest," He says. <sup>1</sup> Matt 11:28
- "Be anxious for nothing." <sup>2</sup> Phil 4:6
- I want to pray without ceasing. <sup>3</sup> I Thess 5:16
- In short, I want to be a doer, not just a hearer. <sup>4</sup> James 1:22-25

#### EXPECTATIONS

- God told Abram to uproot his entire life, and with that command came the promise that he would father a great nation. <sup>5</sup> Genesis 12:1-3
- "'This man shall not be your heir; your very own son shall be your heir.' And He brought him outside and said, 'Look toward heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them.' Then He said to him, 'So shall your offspring be.' And he believed the Lord, and He counted it to him as righteousness." <sup>6</sup> Genesis 15:2-6
- "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love." <sup>7</sup> 1 John 4:18
- "By faith, Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going. By faith, he made his home in the Promised Land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God. And by faith even Sarah, who was past childbearing age, was enabled to bear children because she considered Him faithful who had made the promise. And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore." <sup>8</sup> Hebrews 11:8-12
- "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness." <sup>9</sup> Lamentations 3:22-23
- "I believe; help my unbelief!" <sup>10</sup> Matthew 9:24

## FEAR

- He already understood that “some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God,” as he would later write in the Psalms. <sup>11</sup> Psalm 20:7
- *The best-laid plans of mice and men...* as they say. <sup>12</sup> From the poem “To a Mouse” by Robert Burns
- For “who of you, by worrying, can add a single hour to your life? Since you cannot do this very little thing, why do you worry about the rest?” <sup>13</sup> Luke 12:25
- To quote another of David’s Psalms: “...for You alone, O Lord, make me dwell in safety....” <sup>14</sup> Psalm 4:8
- “Therefore, I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? Therefore, do not be anxious, saying, ‘What shall we eat?’ or ‘What shall we drink?’ or ‘What shall we wear?’ For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.” <sup>15</sup> Matthew 6:25-33
- “Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” <sup>16</sup> Philippians 4:6-7
- But turning to Him in your weakness converts it into strength. <sup>17</sup> 2 Corinthians 12:9-10

## SELF-SUFFICIENCY

- Thankfully, God’s thoughts are not our thoughts, and His ways are not our ways. <sup>18</sup> Isaiah 55:8
- I can truly say I believe that “the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us....” <sup>19</sup> Romans 8:18
- Like the Israelites, we think we would’ve been better off if we’d stayed in Egypt. It feels like the Lord brought us out into the desert to starve. <sup>20</sup> Exodus 16:3
- “He must increase, but I must decrease.” <sup>21</sup> John 3:30
- But when you deny yourself and take up your cross and follow *Him*, He renews your strength, and you will “run and not be weary...walk and not faint.” <sup>22</sup> Isaiah 40:31
- The actual path requires a progression: “...suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope....” <sup>23</sup> Romans 5:3-4
- But we can only have hope in all circumstances if we’re living lives of faith like Abraham who “...believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness.” <sup>24</sup> Genesis 15:6

## DOUBT

- There are many *surface* inconsistencies in cultural Christianity that lead people away from Christ, but I've found that those who don't stop there, but study, dig deep, and really want truth come out with a faith richer than they began with. I don't cover this type of doubt in my discussion here, but I didn't want to ignore it completely. <sup>25</sup> Deuteronomy 4:29, <sup>26</sup> Proverbs 8:17, <sup>27</sup> Jeremiah 29:13, <sup>28</sup> Matthew 7:7, <sup>29</sup> Luke 11:9
- It's that "hope in what you do not see...." <sup>30</sup> Romans 8:25
- Anyone can believe if they've seen God blaze the trail before them miraculously, and sometimes, He does just that, as when He parted the Red Sea for the Israelites. <sup>31</sup> Exodus 14:21
- So, He asks you to trust when the signs are still unclear and all you have is the whisper of His still, small voice. <sup>32</sup> I Kings 19:12
- But He "made a way in the wilderness." <sup>33</sup> Isaiah 43:19
- I can imagine him shrugging here before he continued, "But at your word...." <sup>34</sup> Luke 5:5
- Peter didn't just step out of the boat to join Jesus walking on the water. *He asked Jesus to tell him to, then waited for an invitation.* <sup>35</sup> Matthew 14: 25-29
- I think we often see this belief as a passive acceptance of Christ's identity, but we need to take it in context with the way Abraham believed God—leaving his home and all he knew, not knowing where he was going. <sup>36</sup> Hebrews 11:8
- The Israelites chose not to look back at God when they began to flounder, but continued wallowing in constant fear of their worldly situation. They wanted earthly solutions, and they were not allowed to enter God's rest because their unbelief led to disobedience, hardened hearts, rebellion, and ultimately, a total departure from God. <sup>37</sup> Hebrews 3:19
- Never hesitate to turn to Him, and "hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the hope firm to the end." <sup>38</sup> Hebrews 3:6

## PLEASURE

- *It would seem that our Lord finds our desires not too strong, but too weak. We are half-hearted creatures, fooling about with drink and sex and ambition when infinite joy is offered us, like an ignorant child who wants to go on making mud pies in a slum because he cannot imagine what is meant by the offer of a holiday at the sea. - Our flesh is weak. <sup>40</sup> Matthew 26:41
- The prodigal son.... <sup>41</sup> Luke 15:11-32
- Tempting us to seek our reward on this earth is a cruel trick the devil likes to play. He promises delight but delivers emptiness, for "whoever seeks to save his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life will preserve it." <sup>42</sup> Luke 17:33
- We don't consider that we're trading overflowing fountains of eternal living water for broken cisterns and empty wells. <sup>43</sup> Jeremiah 2:13
- "Whatever my eyes desired I did not keep from them. I did not withhold my heart from any pleasure, for my heart rejoiced in all my labor; and this was my reward from all my labor. Then I looked on all the works that my hands had done and on the labor in which I

had toiled; and indeed, all was vanity and grasping for the wind. There was no profit under the sun.”<sup>44</sup> Ecclesiastes 2:10-11

- “Find rest, O my soul, in God alone; my hope comes from Him. He alone is my rock and my salvation....”<sup>45</sup> Psalm 62:5-6
- “For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come.”<sup>46</sup> Hebrews 13:14
- When you are tired and tempted in the flesh, “do not grow weary of doing good, for in due season you will reap, if you do not give up.”<sup>47</sup> Galatians 6:9

## ABANDONMENT

- *Wherever the providence of God may dump us down, in a slum, in a shop, in the desert, we have to labour along the line of His direction. - *I'm with you.*<sup>49</sup> Hebrews 13:5
- *I'll fight for you.*<sup>50</sup> Exodus 14:14
- *I'll protect you.*<sup>51</sup> Psalm 121:7
- *I'll take care of you.*<sup>52</sup> Philippians 4:19
- When his brothers sold him, maybe Joseph even held himself somewhat accountable for their anger (though the punishment certainly didn't fit the crime). He *had* been talking about that dream....<sup>53</sup> Genesis 37:5-11
- I love Joseph's words when he refused Potiphar's wife: “How then could I do such a wicked thing and sin against God?”<sup>54</sup> Genesis 39:9
- What if he'd been mad at God and languishing in captivity instead of “working as for the Lord?”<sup>55</sup> Colossians 3:23
- What if I trusted Him *now* and “counted it all joy when I met trials of all kinds, knowing that the testing of my faith produces perseverance, and at the end of perseverance comes *perfection*—a lack of nothing?”<sup>56</sup> James 1:2-4
- I think it goes back to that “all” we will have when we seek Him first.<sup>57</sup> Matthew 6:33
- The “all” is HIM—the intimacy, the rest, the fullness of a relationship with Him gives us the “peace that passes all understanding.”<sup>58</sup> Philippians 4:7
- The story of how he contrived to get them to bring the rest of the family back to Egypt is long, but in it, we see his brokenness, his loneliness, his hope, and possibly, even a little of his anger.<sup>59</sup> Genesis 42:6-45:28
- “But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death.”<sup>60</sup> James 1:14-15

## INSUFFICIENCY

- Have you ever really thought about the little boy with the five loaves and two fish?<sup>61</sup> John 6:9
- “Has He said, and will He not do it? Or has He spoken, and will He not fulfill it?”<sup>62</sup> Numbers 23:19b

- Could Moses have parted the sea? <sup>63</sup> Exodus 14:21
- Could Daniel have closed the lions' mouths? <sup>64</sup> Daniel 6:22
- "Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong." <sup>65</sup> I Corinthians 1:26-29
- For I am certain "that He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ." <sup>66</sup> Philippians 1:6
- He takes whatever you have and multiplies it beyond "all you could ask or think." <sup>67</sup> Ephesians 3:20

## **FAILURE**

- Like Paul, he "did not do the good he wanted, but the evil he did not want is what he kept on doing." <sup>68</sup> Romans 7:19
- Like Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, we don't want to face His rebuke or our shame, so we hide. <sup>69</sup> Genesis 3:8
- Just before they went to the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus warned him: "Peter, the rooster will not crow this day until you deny three times that you know Me." <sup>70</sup> Matthew 26:34-35
- Peter had failed, yet here was Jesus coming after him, renewing the sense of awe and wonder that had first drawn him—restoring the joy of his salvation. <sup>71</sup> Psalm 51:12
- For "godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation without regret, whereas worldly grief produces death." <sup>72</sup> 2 Corinthians 7:10
- There's no amount of feeling sufficiently guilty—no mortification or punishment you can put on yourself that makes up for your failing. Jesus is our advocate—our defender before the throne. <sup>73</sup> I John 2:1
- "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments." <sup>74</sup> John 14:15

## **SUFFERING, PERSECUTION, AND OTHER GENERALLY HARD THINGS**

- "...for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose." <sup>75</sup> Romans 8:28
- "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit." <sup>76</sup> John 12:24
- They couldn't have known what fruit their sacrifice would produce, but Paul later writes of his suffering: "I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory." <sup>77</sup> 2 Timothy 2:10
- What Joseph's brothers meant for evil, God meant for good. <sup>78</sup> Genesis 50:20
- The disciples asked, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" Jesus answered, "It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him." <sup>79</sup> John 9:2-3
- "Since therefore Christ suffered in the flesh, arm yourselves with the same way of thinking, for whoever has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, so as to live for the rest of the time in the flesh no longer for human passions but for the will of God." <sup>80</sup> I Peter 4:1

- I already mentioned this Bible verse in the chapter on self-sufficiency, but it's too good not to use again: "we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope...." <sup>81</sup> Romans 5:3-4
- "There is a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance...." <sup>82</sup> Ecclesiastes 3:4
- Even Jesus prayed, "If it be possible, let this cup pass from Me." <sup>83</sup> Matthew 26:39
- Like Job, it's OK to ask, "Why, Lord?" <sup>84</sup> Job 7:20
- Like Jesus, it's OK to cry out, "My God, my God, why have You forsaken me?" <sup>85</sup> Matt 27:46
- "Though He slay me, I will hope in Him." <sup>86</sup> Job 13:15
- "Nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." <sup>87</sup> Matthew 26:39
- "For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong." <sup>88</sup> 2 Corinthians 12:10
- "...let those who suffer according to God's will entrust their souls to a faithful Creator while doing good." <sup>89</sup> I Peter 4:19
- "Do not resist the one who is evil. But if anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles." <sup>90</sup> Matthew 5:39-41
- "...you joyfully accepted the plundering of your property, since you knew that you yourselves had a better possession and an abiding one." <sup>91</sup> Hebrews 10:34
- "...do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear Him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground apart from your Father." <sup>92</sup> Matthew 10:28-29
- It looks like not insulting when we are insulted and not threatening when we are abused. <sup>93</sup> I Peter 2:23
- "...be patient in tribulation." <sup>94</sup> Romans 12:12
- "Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all." <sup>95</sup> Romans 12:17
- It looks like being afflicted, but not crushed, perplexed, but not driven to despair, persecuted, but not forsaken, struck down, but not destroyed. <sup>96</sup> 2 Corinthians 4:8
- But we should "not grow weary of doing good, for in due season we will reap, if we do not give up." <sup>97</sup> Galatians 6:9
- "Fret not yourself because of evildoers; be not envious of wrongdoers. For they will soon fade like the grass and wither like the green herb." <sup>98</sup> Psalm 37:1
- "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." <sup>99</sup> Romans 12:19
- "If possible, so far as it depends on us, to live peaceably with all, and never avenge ourselves, but leave the wrath to God." <sup>100</sup> Romans 12:18-19
- I'm also talking about the everyday trials and difficulties that come from living in this fallen world—the "rain that falls on the just and the unjust alike...." <sup>101</sup> Matthew 5:45
- "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness." <sup>102</sup> James 1:2-3
- "In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, so that the tested genuineness of your faith—more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ." <sup>103</sup> I Peter 1:6-7

- God turns mourning into dancing.... <sup>104</sup> Psalm 30:11
- ...ashes into beauty....<sup>105</sup> Isaiah 61:3
- ...death into victory.... <sup>106</sup> I Corinthians 15:55-57
- “For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith. Who is it that overcomes the world except the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?” <sup>107</sup> I John 5:4
- “For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us.” <sup>108</sup> Romans 8:18
- “For this light, momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.”

### DISTRACTION

- He told us to “number our days....” <sup>110</sup> Psalm 90:12
- ...because we aren’t guaranteed tomorrow. <sup>111</sup> James 4:14
- He told us to “make the best use of our time.” <sup>112</sup> Colossians 4:5 and Ephesians 5:16
- “Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died.” <sup>113</sup> John 11:32
- Arriving after Lazarus’s death, He was “deeply moved” and “greatly troubled” by Mary’s grief, and He wept as He inquired about Lazarus’s tomb. <sup>114</sup> John 11:33-35
- That’s why we must “seek first the Kingdom of God....” <sup>115</sup> Matthew 6:33
- “...pray without ceasing.” <sup>116</sup> I Thessalonians 5:17
- But Jesus answered, “Let us go on to the next towns, that I may preach there also, for that is why I came out.” <sup>117</sup> Mark 1:37-38
- “Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed Him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord’s feet and listened to His teaching. But Martha was distracted with much serving. And she went up to Him and said, ‘Lord, do You not care that my sister has left me to serve alone? Tell her then to help me.’ But the Lord answered her, ‘Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her.’”

- “For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if anyone builds on the foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw—each one’s work will become manifest, for the Day will disclose it, because it will be revealed by fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done. ## LAZINESS

- The Bible makes it clear that believers *will* bear good fruit. <sup>131</sup> John 15, <sup>132</sup> Matthew 7:16-20, <sup>133</sup> Jeremiah 17:7-8
- I could do all the paperwork and all the home repairs and work all the overtime, but if I have not love, I am nothing. <sup>134</sup> I Corinthians 13:2
- Faith without works is dead. <sup>135</sup> James 2:17
- “There is no burden which, if we lift it cheerfully and bear it with love in our hearts, will not become a blessing to us. God means our tasks to be our helpers; to refuse to bend our shoulders to receive a load is to decline a new opportunity for growth.” <sup>136</sup> *Glimpses Through Life’s Windows: Selections from the Writings of J. R. Miller*
- “Here I am; send me!” <sup>137</sup> Isaiah 6:8
- “Drudgery is the touchstone of character. ## HURRY

- I'm sure if I could see myself at those moments, I'd look something like Bilbo when he was tempted to take the ring of power back from Frodo—"a little wrinkled creature with a hungry face and bony, groping hands." <sup>142</sup> *The Fellowship of the Ring* – J.R.R. Tolkien
- The Israelites were on the cusp of a battle, and when they saw the multitude of the Philistine's forces, they began to scatter and hide. <sup>143</sup> I Samuel 13:6
- Samuel had said he would meet them to make a sacrifice to the Lord in seven days and then instruct them what to do. <sup>144</sup> I Samuel 10:8
- A part of me wants to delve deeply into how singleness is not a punishment, how the Bible even says "it is good to remain single...." <sup>145</sup> I Corinthians 7:8
- "It is good that one should wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord." <sup>146</sup> Lamentations 3:26
- "The only test as to whether we ought to allow an emotion to have its way is to see what the outcome of the emotion will be. - Yes, “all we can do” is take our requests to the Creator of the universe, our Father who loves us unconditionally, who bids us ask and receive that our joy would be made full.... <sup>306</sup> John 16:24
- ...and that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need. <sup>307</sup> Hebrews 4:16
- “All we can do” is petition the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords who conquered death.... <sup>308</sup> I Corinthians 15:55
- ...and laid the foundations of the earth. <sup>309</sup> Job 38:4
- We suddenly remember that verse about praying without doubt in our hearts.... <sup>310</sup> Matthew 11:23
- Praying for deep spiritual things and for your neighbor’s cousin who has cancer should be done, of course, but what if you started your prayers by praying for your “daily bread?” <sup>311</sup> Matthew 6:11
- He would not have you come with pretense and pride like the Pharisees.... <sup>312</sup> Luke 18:11-12
- ...or with many words like the Gentiles. <sup>313</sup> Matthew 6:7
- God would have you come in humility.... <sup>314</sup> Luke 18:13-14

- Indeed, you don't need words at all, for "the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words." <sup>315</sup> Romans 8:26
- "I believe, help my unbelief!" <sup>316</sup> Matthew 9:24
- Paul prayed that his "thorn in the flesh" would be removed, but it was not. <sup>317</sup> 2 Corinthians 12:7-10
- Jesus prayed that the cup would pass from Him, but it did not. <sup>318</sup> Matthew 26:39
- God will only give you good gifts.... <sup>319</sup> Matthew 7:11
- "Nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will." <sup>320</sup> Matthew 26:39
- God is our "refuge and strength, a very present help *in* trouble." <sup>321</sup> Psalm 46:1
- "You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions." <sup>322</sup> James 4:3
- And we must ask "in His name." <sup>323</sup> John 14:13
- We are definitely to be in constant fellowship with the Father—to "pray without ceasing...." <sup>324</sup> I Thessalonians 5:17
- "The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. Then he prayed again, and heaven gave rain, and the earth bore its fruit." <sup>325</sup> James 5:16-18
- Joshua prayed that the sun would stand still, and "the sun stopped in the midst of heaven and did not hurry to set for about a whole day. There has been no day like it before or since, when the Lord heeded the voice of a man, for the Lord fought for Israel." <sup>326</sup> Joshua 10:13-14

- In Mark 9, after Jesus cast the demon out of the boy, the disciples ask why they could not "and He said unto them, 'This kind can come forth by nothing but by prayer and fasting.'" <sup>331</sup> Mark 9:29 KJV
- It's a powerful way to teach yourself to mind the things of the spirit rather than the things of the flesh. <sup>332</sup> Romans 8:5
- It is a tangible way to "turn to the Lord, so the veil is removed." <sup>333</sup> 2 Corinthians 3:16

## SATISFACTION

- “I am the Bread of Life. Whoever comes to Me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in Me will never be thirsty.” <sup>334</sup> John 6:35
- Like the men who gave excuses in the “Parable of the Great Banquet....” <sup>335</sup> Luke 14:12-24
- God has provisioned the table and supplied all our needs. <sup>336</sup> Philippians 4:19
- We haven’t “tasted and seen that the Lord is good....” <sup>337</sup> Psalm 34:8
- Everything else will pass away; our days are like grass that will wither in a moment. <sup>338</sup> Psalm 103:15
- “But godliness with contentment is great gain, for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world.” <sup>339</sup> I Timothy 6:6-7
- He will supply everything you need along the way. <sup>340</sup> Luke 12:24
- “Out of your heart will flow rivers of living water.” <sup>341</sup> John 7:37
- But God is reminding me that “my times are in *His* hands.” <sup>342</sup> Psalm 31:15
- No one took Christ’s life from Him because He laid it down of His own accord. <sup>343</sup> John 10:18

- “Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise Him.” <sup>353</sup> Psalm 42:5
- It seems unfathomable at the beginning of your faith journey, but we’re actually told to “give thanks in all circumstances.” <sup>354</sup> I Thessalonians 5:18
- When Daniel found out he would be cast into a den of lions if he prayed to someone other than the king, he simply continued his normal habit of praying and giving thanks to God. <sup>355</sup> Daniel 6:10

- When David was hiding in the caves as King Saul sought to kill him, David gave thanks and sang praises to God. <sup>356</sup> Psalm 57:9
- When Jesus told the disciples He was about to be delivered up and sacrificed, He was still giving thanks. <sup>357</sup> Matthew 26:2-27
- If you've never "launched out into the deep at His word...." <sup>358</sup> Luke 5:3-5
- You would be right; it is the "pearl of great price...." <sup>359</sup> Matthew 13:45-46

## DELIGHT

- The Bible says that the joy of the Lord is our strength. <sup>360</sup> Nehemiah 8:10
- David says, "I delight to do your will, O my God; your law is within my heart." <sup>361</sup> Psalm 40:8
- As I drew near to Him, He drew near to me. <sup>362</sup> James 4:8

- Delighting in the things around you and your daily tasks leads to delight in God, for "through Him all things were made." <sup>364</sup> John 1:3

- The joy set before us is worth it. God has “put eternity into our hearts....”<sup>384</sup> Ecclesiastes 3:11
